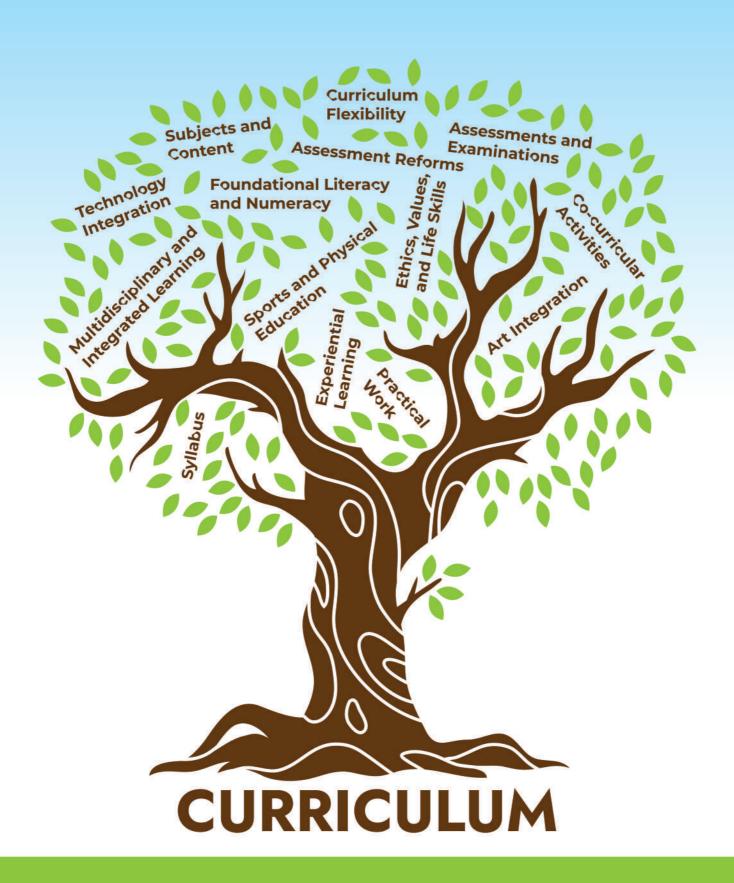

As rhymes are made up of patterns, they become easy for memorisation. Hearing and using rhyme, rhythm,and repetition helps children develop early literacy skills. It also helps children to develop their expression, emotions, body language with the help of sounds, words and phrases. Most importantly, the learning goes in a fun and positive way
- 3. Young children always observe and pick things from their surroundings. Introducing them to the environment will help to improve their reasoning skills, thinking skills, and social skills.
- 4. Conversation skills are important for children's development and wellbeing. That's because being able to ask for what they need and develop strong relationships with others. conversation skills are about being able to talk and listen well.
- 5. Colouring can help children learn the skills of patience. It allows them to be relaxed and comfortable. Besides, it improves handwriting skills and develops hand- eye coordinations, fine motor skills and gives an opportunity to know about the objects in their surroundings.

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
