Life of the People

Inuits (or Eskimos) are the original inhabitants of Greenland. They are generally short and stout people with yellow coloured skin. They were long leather shoes, mittens, double sets of trousers, and coat called **Parkas** made of animal fur.

Inuits do not have permanent houses. In winters, they live in houses made of snow called **igloos**. **Igloos** are dome-shaped houses with a single opening. In summers, they live in tents made of animal skin called **tou pigs**.

Most of the people are hunters. They use harpoons to hunt animals. They also catch fish to eat and sell. They use **kayaks** to catch fish.

They survive freezing temperatures for months at a time by developing some specialized features that help them stay warm, including insulating fur, layers of fat, and oily skin coatings.

Economy

Fishing is the major industry of Greenland. Agriculture and sheep rearing are also practised on the southwestern coast of Greenland. Greenland is also rich in minerals, such as lead and zinc. These minerals are also exported to other parts of the world.
