5. Igloos are temporary houses made of blocks of ice by the Inuit.

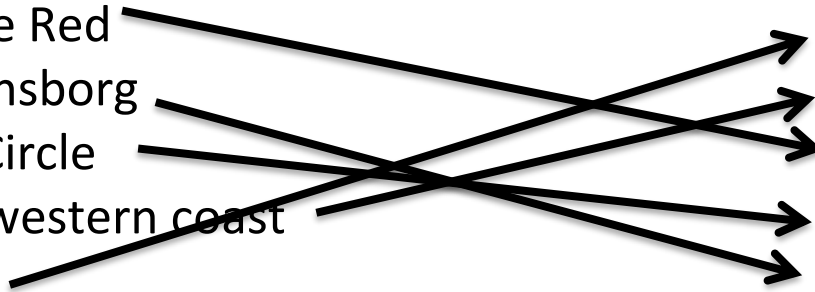
