Ans. Climate of Greenland:-

Ans. A very large piece of ice floating in the sea is called an iceberg. They are dangerous because icebergs are actually much larger than they seem. This is because when an iceberg floats on water, most of it remains under water.

Therefore they pose great danger to ships in the sea.

Ans. Wildlife of Greenland:-

Only those animals that can withstand the extreme cold are found in Greenland.
