DISTRIBUTIVE ADJECTIVES



Each girl will get a chocolate.

He used to call me everyday.

I like **neither** of you.

Is there any money left?

Each, every, neither, any are referring to individual members of a group.

Adjectives that refer to individual members of a group are called distributive adjectives.

Some examples- each, every, neither, either, any, both etc.



Points to remember

Each: Each is used to refer to one specific person of a group.

Every: Every is use to refer to each member of a group

Either: Either is used to refer to one or the other between

two options.

Neither: Neither means that none of the option listed can be considered.
