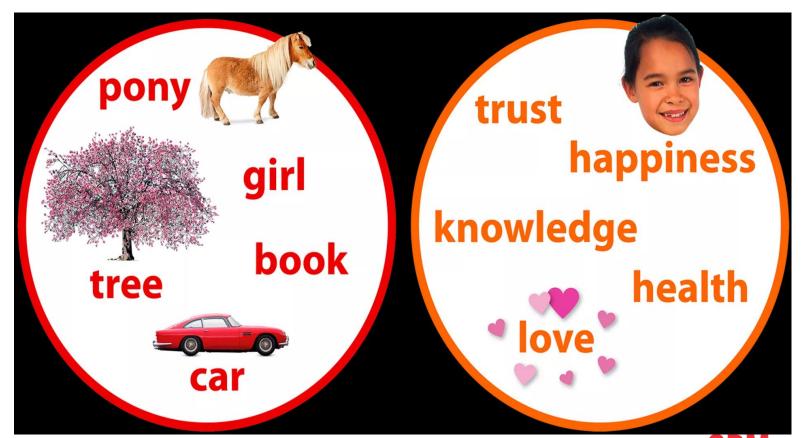

CONCRETE NOUNS

A concrete noun is a noun that can be identified through one of the five senses (taste, touch, sight, hearing or smell).

Would someone please answer the phone?

Phone

In the sentence above, the noun phone is a concrete noun. You can touch it, see it, hear it, and may be even smell it.



Abstract nouns

An abstract noun is a noun that refers to an intangible concept such as an emotion, a feeling, a quality or an idea. In other words, an abstract noun does not refer to a physical object.

He felt he would burst with anger and shame.
