- Being outdoors in nature, with all its unpredictability can benefit anyone, anywhere at any time. Thus, the poem teaches us that nothing in this world, no matter how small, is unworthy. Every object is significant. It also shows us that even the smallest things in life can bring us happiness, just as the snow did for the poet.
