THEME OF THE POEM

- The records the poet's earliest memory.
- An incident that occurred when she was around three years old.
- While walking along a dusty road, she saw an old lady sitting under a tree.
- The lady invited her over and gave her bilberries and cream to eat, a 'feast' that the poet recalls with pleasure.
- Although it seems as if the poem has no serious theme or purpose, the last lines suggest some importance, more than just telling about her childhood.
- She shows that this simple, pleasant memory means much to her.



EXPLANATION

The poet in this poem is reminiscing her past...

All the small things in her life seem very great to her..

- She loves the dusty road, mountain, old house and recalls those memories
- She also thinks of that old woman whose appearance creates ripples in her mind.
- At that time the poet was only three...
- She also thinks of the dusty road and the love the woman gave her...



- The poet was only three years old—very small when her childhood memories still make her life refresh...
- The old lady sang softly and the cat purred.
- She served the poet berries and cream that the poet loved a lot.
- The taste of the berries, the feel of the summer still linger in his memory...
- The only sadness and melancholy is she has grown up..



VOCABULARY

- Bilberries-a small dark blue edible fruit
- Hummed-sang softly to herself
- Purr-cat making vibrating sound while sleeping
- Farthest-at the greatest distance
