VOCABULARY JUNCTION

Suffixes are placed after words to modify their meanings; like prefixes, they are groups of letters that rarely serve a purpose unless attached to a word.



SUFFIX	MEANING	EXAMPLES
-able/-ible	capable of being	portable, legible, preventable, adaptable
-ac/-ic	like/related to	cardiac, iconic, organic
-acy	state/quality of being	privacy, legitimacy, bureaucracy
-ious	full of	gracious, malicious, ambitious
-al	related to	logical, philosophical, bacterial



Prefixes


A prefix is an affix (letter or group of letters) attached to the beginning of a word that partly indicates its meaning.

Prefix	Definition	Example
anti-	against	antibiotic
bi-	two	bicycle
dis-	apart, away from	dissatisfied, disillusion
hyper-	extremely	hyperactive
inter-	between	interaction, intermingle
intra-	within	intracoastal
intro-	inward	introduction
macro-	large	macroeconomics
micro-	tiny, small	microscope
mis-	wrong	misuse, misinform
mono-	one	monolingual
multi-	many	multinational

A **suffix** is a letter or set of letters added to end of a word to form a new word.

A prefix is a letter or a set of letters added to the end of a word to form a new word.


