Perfect Tenses

AT A GLANCE

- 1) Perfect tenses are of six types.
- 2) They are present perfect, past perfect, future perfect, present perfect continuous, past perfect continuous and future perfect continuous.
- 3) It shows different types of actions like an action completed in the past, an action that has just been completed and an action that will be completed in the future before a given time.
- 4) Present perfect tense talks about actions that began in the past and have been completed in the present.
- 5) The structure of present perfect tense is has/have + the past participle form of the verb
- 6) Past perfect tense talks about the actions that began in the past and were completed before another action that took place in a more recent past.
- 7) The structure of past perfect tense is had + past participle form of the verb.
- 8) The future perfect tense talks about actions that will be completed by or before a certain time in the future.
- 9) The structure of future perfect tense is will/shall + have + past participle form of the verb.
- 10) Present perfect continuous tense talks about actions started at a particular time in the past and is continuing in the present.
- 11) Its structure is has/have been + verb + ing
- 12) Past perfect continuous tense talks about an action that continued for some time in the past and ended at another time in the past.
- 13) Its structure is had been + verb + ing.
- 14) Future perfect continuous talks about unfinished actions or events that will go on till a point of time in the future.
- 15) Its structure is will/shall + have been + verb + ing
