
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## THE PAST PERFECT TENSE





## STRUCTURE HAD + PAST PARTICIPLE

### **Examples:**

- I had been (I'd been)
- You had gone (you'd gone)
- She had met (she'd met)
- He had played (he'd played)
- It had rained (it'd rained)
- We had bought (we'd bought)
- They had studied (they'd studied)

#### FOR THE **NEGATIVE** JUST ADD 'NOT':

- I had not been (I hadn't been)
- You had not gone (you hadn't gone)
- She had not met (she hadn't met)
- He had not played (he hadn't played)
- It had not rained (it hadn't rained)
- We had not bought (we hadn't bought)
- They had not studied (they hadn't studied)



### TO MAKE A **'YES /NO' QUESTION** PUT **'HAD**' BEFORE THE SUBJECT:

- Had I come?
- Had you eaten?
- Had she gone?
- Had it rained?
- Had he studied?
- Had we met?
- Had they left?



#### LET'S PRACTICE:

- When I arrived at the cinema, the filmHad started (start).
- She <u>Had li</u>ved (live) in China before she went to Thailand.
- After they Had eaten (eat) the shellfish, they began to feel sick.
- The grass was yellow because it Hadn't rained (not /rain) all summer.
- The lights went off because we \_Hadn'tp\_aid \_\_\_\_\_\_(not /pay) the electricity bill.
- The children <u>Hadn't done</u> (not /
  do) their homework so they were in trouble

- If you <u>Had lis tened</u> (listen) to me, you would have got the job.
- Julie didn't arrive until after I <u>Had left</u> (leave).
- They <u>Hadn't</u> eaten (not /eat) so we went to a restaurant.
- We couldn't go into the concert because we
   Hadn't brought (not /bring) our tickets.

- When we <u>Had finished</u> (finish) dinner, we went out.
- The garden was dead because it <u>Had</u>
   been
   (be) dry all summer.
- She said that she <u>Hadn't</u> visit ed (not /visit) the UK before.
- Julie and Anne <u>Hadn't</u> met (not /meet) before the party.

#### SIMPLE PAST VS PAST PERFECT

- We use Simple Past if we want to tell what happened some time in the past.
- We use Past Perfect if we want to tell what had
- happened before/up to a certain time in the past

Simple Past		Past Perfect Simple	
some time in the past		before/up to a certain time in the past	
Example:	Jane got up at seven. She opened her birthday presents and then the whole family went to the zoo.	Example:	Before her sixth birthday, Jane had never been to the zoo.


### One event happened before another event



Here, we use the past perfect to show that the first event finished before the second event happened.

### Carlos had a terrible day...






Carlos He didn't woke up have time late. to take a shower or eat breakfast.


He didn't have time to take a shower because he'd woken up late.



# The meeting <u>had</u> already <u>started</u> by the time I <u>arrived</u>.



# They <u>had been</u> married for 3 years when they <u>divorced</u>.



### CHOOSE THE CORRECT TENSE (SIMPLE PAST OR PAST PERFECT).

- The wind blew (blow) away the leaves that we had collected (collect).
- She <u>threw</u> (throw) away the letter that she had written (write).
- They <u>showed</u> (show) me the pictures, they <u>had taken</u> (take) during their holidays.
- In the evening, the children told (tell) their daddy what they <u>had seen</u> (see) at the zoo.
- The boy <u>was</u> (be) very sorry for what he <u>had</u> <u>done</u>(do).

What happened first with Past Perfect. What happened second with Simple Past.

- The teacher <u>corrected</u>(correct) the tests we <u>had written</u> (write).

  - My sister didn't see (see / not) the note that I Had laid (lay) on the kitchen table for her.
- We wanted (want) to watch a film that we hadn't seen (see /not) before.
