At a glance:

- A and an are used to talk about one person, one animal, one thing or one place.
- An is used before naming words beginning with a, e, i, o or u.
- A is used before naming words beginning with the rest of the letters i.e. consonants in English Alphabet.

For Example:

a

A is used before words that begin with a consonant.

an

An is used before words that begin with a vowel.
