What are Action Words?



Give some examples of action Words.

I play tennis every day.

I drink milk every day.

These words are used to talk about actions that happen every day. They are in simple present tense.








- > A tense shows the **time** of an action.
- > It tells us when the action is happening.
- > Tense is the form of a verb.
- It shows the time of something that has already happened, or is happening or is going to happen.



What is Simple Present Tense??



➤ The Simple Present tense shows actions that always take place in the **same way** or things that we do **every day**.

Example:

I read the newspaper every day.

I exercise every day.

RULE:

When we use an action word with the pronouns I or you in the Simple Present tense, the letter -s is not added to the action word.





I love reading books.



You clean your room every day.
