RULE 1:

When we use an action word with the pronouns I or you in the Simple Present tense, the letter -s is not added to the action word.





You <u>clean</u> your room every day.



RULE 2:

When we use an action word with she, he or any singular naming word in the Simple Present tense, we add the letter -s to the action word.





She<u>plays</u> basketball.

He <u>gets</u> up early in the morning.
