The dog barks loudly



Snails move slowly

Here, the words *loudly* and *slowly* tell us how the actions are done.

Loudly tells us how the dog *barks*.

Slowly tells us how snails *move*.

Such words are called **adverbs**.

Words that tell us how an action is done are called ***adverbs***.

Most adverbs end with ***ly***.

Examples:



Meena rides her bicycle
carefully.



Amit reads the poem loudly.



Raju speaks quickly.



The child sleeps quietly.



We should eat slowly.



I do my homework carefully.
