The dog barks loudly

Snails move slowly

Here, the words *loudly* and *slowly* tell us how the actions are done.

Loudly tells us how the dog barks. Slowly tells us how snails move. Such words are called **adverbs**.

Words that tell us how an action is done are called *adverbs*. Most adverbs end with *ly*.
