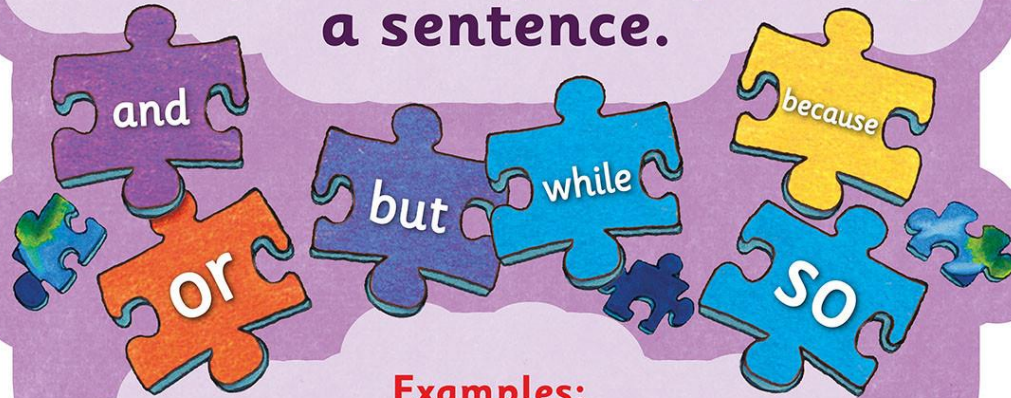
LEARNING OBJECTIVE :

Conjunctions

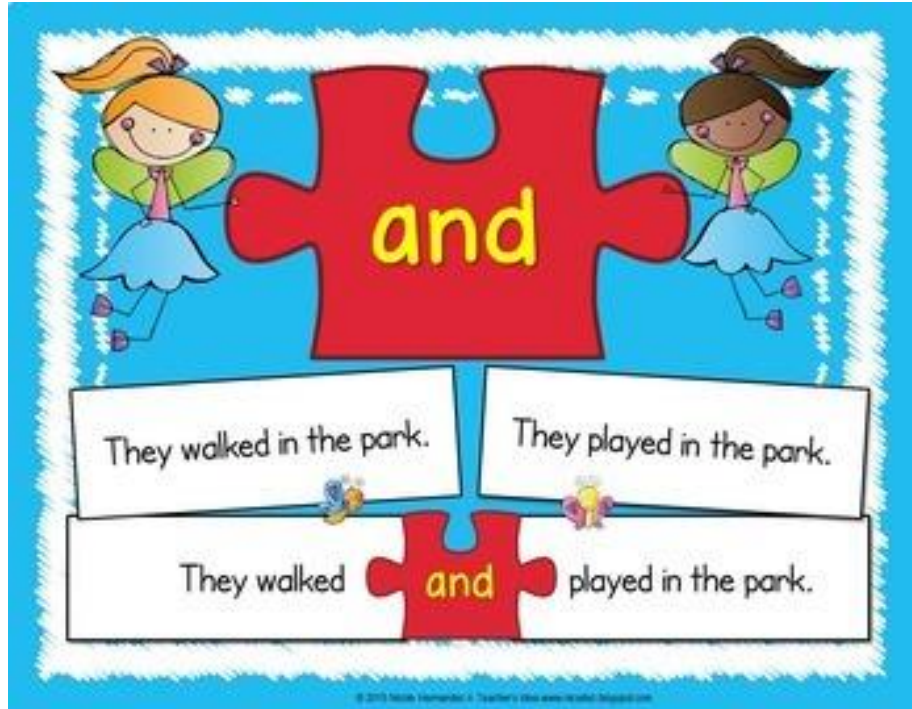
A conjunction joins parts of a sentence.



Examples:

I ate a sandwich **and** I drank some juice.

We can go to the park **or** we can go to the zoo.



We use 'and' to combine two sentences into one and to add more informations.

We use 'and' to combine two sentences into one.



Hamid is a swimmer.

and



Hamid is a dancer.

Hamid is a swimmer and a dancer.



Honey is sweet.

and

Honey is tasty.

Honey is sweet and tasty.



Gia is kind. Gia is caring.

Gia is kind and caring.



We use 'but' to combine two sentences that talk about things or ideas that are different from each other.



Jacob can play cricket.

but

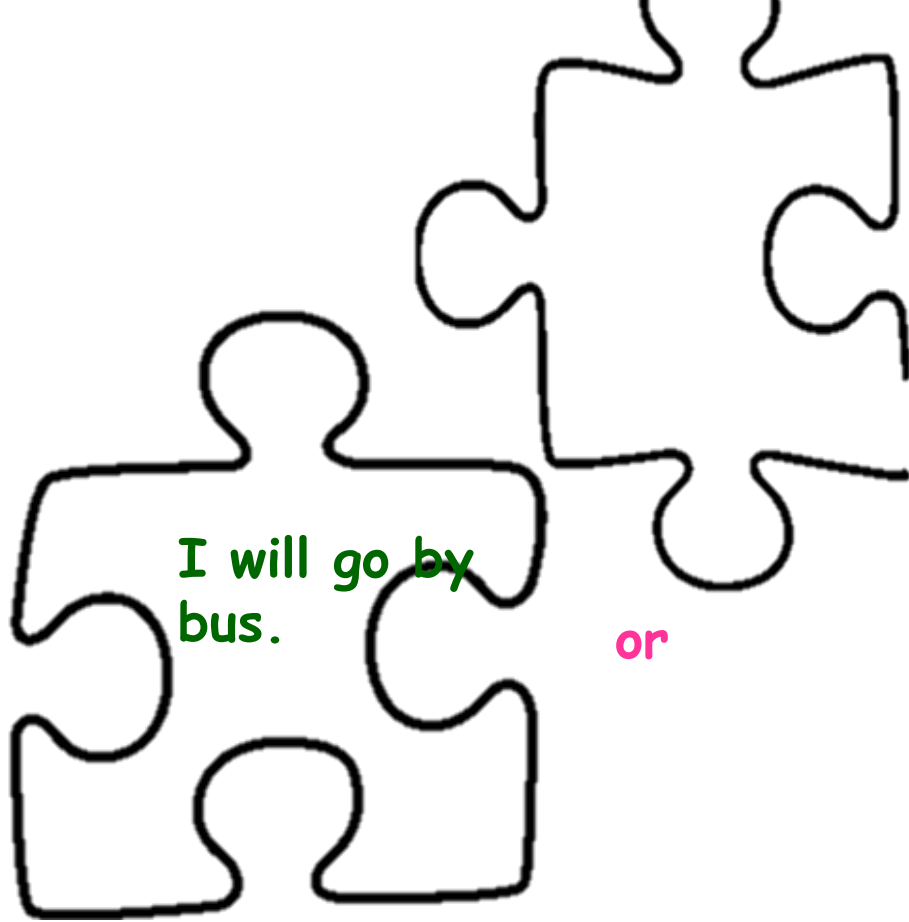
Tina can play tennis.

Jacob can play cricket but Tina
can play tennis.



Gia is tall. Her brother is short.

Gia is tall but her brother is short.



or





We use 'or' to combine two sentences that talk about different choices.



Kavita wants to be an engineer.

or

Kavita wants to be a teacher.

Kavita wants to be an engineer or a teacher.



Will you have milk? Will you have juice?

Will you have milk or juice?

Let's Summarize



- **Conjunctions** are joining words. They join words and sentences.
- We use *and* to combine two sentences into one.
- The conjunction *but* is used to join two sentences that talk about things or ideas that are different from each other.
- *Or* joins two sentences that talk about different choices.
