
Conjunctions - And, But, Or

At a glance



- Conjunctions are joining words. They join words and sentences.
- We use and to combine two words or sentences into one and also to add information.
- Example- Apple is healthy and tasty.
- The conjunction but is used to join two sentences that talk about things or ideas that are different from each other.
- Example- Mohan wants to play outside, but it is raining.
- Or joins two sentences that talk about different choices.
- Example- Do you want cake or chocolate?
