Countable and Uncountable Nouns

STUDY NOTES

At a glance

Countable nouns are things that can be counted.

For examples:

Four boys are playing football.

There are **three biscuits** on the plate.

My father bought two watches.

I ate an apple today.

The buildings are very big.

Here boys, biscuits, watches, apple, and buildings are countable.

Uncountable nouns are the things that we cannot count. They do not have any number, or *a* or *an* before them. But they may have *the* before them.

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For examples:

Ravi asked me for some water.

Hamid had some milk and cornflakes for breakfast.

I drank the **juice** in the glass.

Grandpa doesn't like **sugar** in his **tea**.
