Things that can be counted



UNCOUNTABLE

Things that cannot be counted

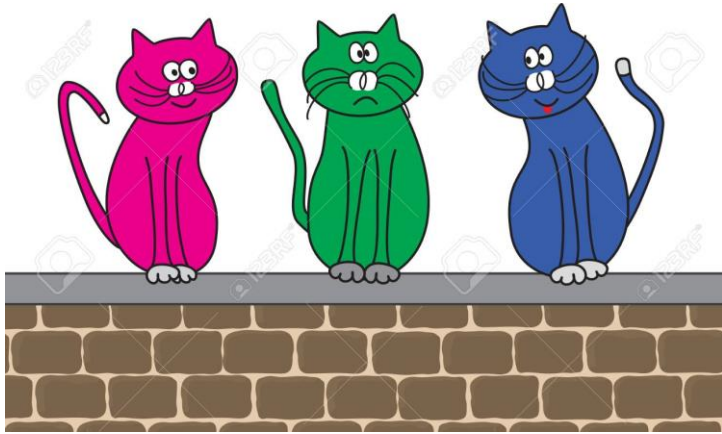
Countable Nouns



There are **five apples** in the basket.



The **two cars** are on the road.



The **kittens** are sitting on the wall.



My **sister** is playing with her **six dolls**.

Countable nouns are names of things that can be counted for.

Things to remember

Countable nouns may have a, an or the before them.

'A' comes before singular countable nouns that start with consonant sound.



Vani is eating **a** sandwich.

Things to remember

'An' comes before singular countable nouns that start with vowel sound.



Harsh is eating **an** egg.

‘A’ and ‘an’ are used when we do not talk about particular people, places, things and animals.

‘The’ is used when we talk about particular people, places, things and animals.



I want to buy **the** book that I saw yesterday.
