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

YESTERDAY

Sam played blocks.



The action is done in the past.

PAST TENSE

TODAY

The children play.



The action happens today or every day.

PRESENT TENSE

TOMORROW


She <u>will play</u> with her doll.



The action will be done in the future.


FUTURE TENSE





The sentences that tell us about actions that are happening everyday or things that are always tru are in present tense.


Examples:





Present Tense

We add —s or —es to verbs in present tense when we use them with he, she, it, or a singular noun. We do not add anything to verbs with I, you, we, they or plural nouns.





Examples

Singular Subject	Verb + s / es	Object

Не	plays	cricket.
She	rides	a horse.
It	flies	in the sky.
The teacher	teaches	math.

Plural	Verb	Object

We	play	football.
They	ride	bikes.
The birds	fly	in the sky.

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

In the words time and rhyme, the letters i_e and y make the long i sound. But, they are written differently. The letters ie, i and igh make same sound.












