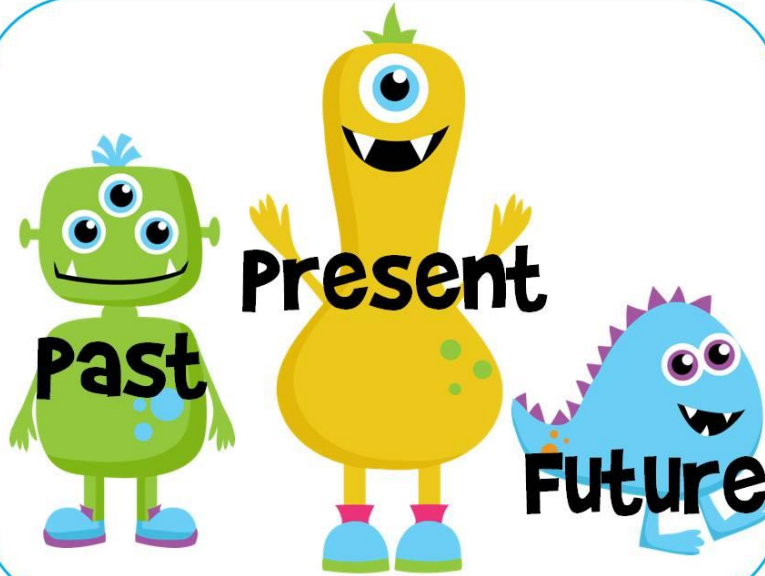

The Speech Bubble

TENSES OF THE VERBS

YESTERDAY

Sam played blocks.



The action is done in the past.

PAST TENSE

TODAY

The children play.



The action happens today or every day.

PRESENT TENSE

TOMORROW

She will play with her doll.



The action will be done in the future.

FUTURE TENSE



The sentences that tell us about actions that are happening everyday or things that are always true are in present tense.

Examples:

Subject-Verb Present Simple Tense



He hears.



He hides.



They hug.



He kicks.

Present Tense

We add –s or –es to verbs in present tense when we use them with he, she, it, or a singular noun.

We do not add anything to verbs with I, you, we, they or plural nouns.


Simple Present Tense



Rule: Sub.+ V1 + s/es + Object (Singular Subjects)

Rule: Sub.+ V1 + Object (Plural Subjects)

(Singular Subject)
Child plays.

(Plural Subjects)
Children play.





Examples

Singular Subject	Verb + s / es	Object
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He	plays	cricket.
She	rides	a horse.
It	flies	in the sky.
The teacher	teaches	math.

Examples

Plural Subject	Verb	Object
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We	play	football.
They	ride	bikes.
The birds	fly	in the sky.

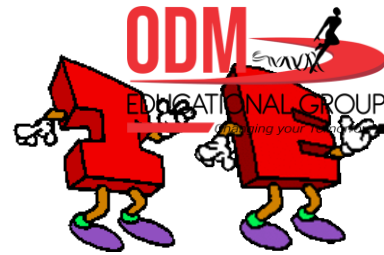

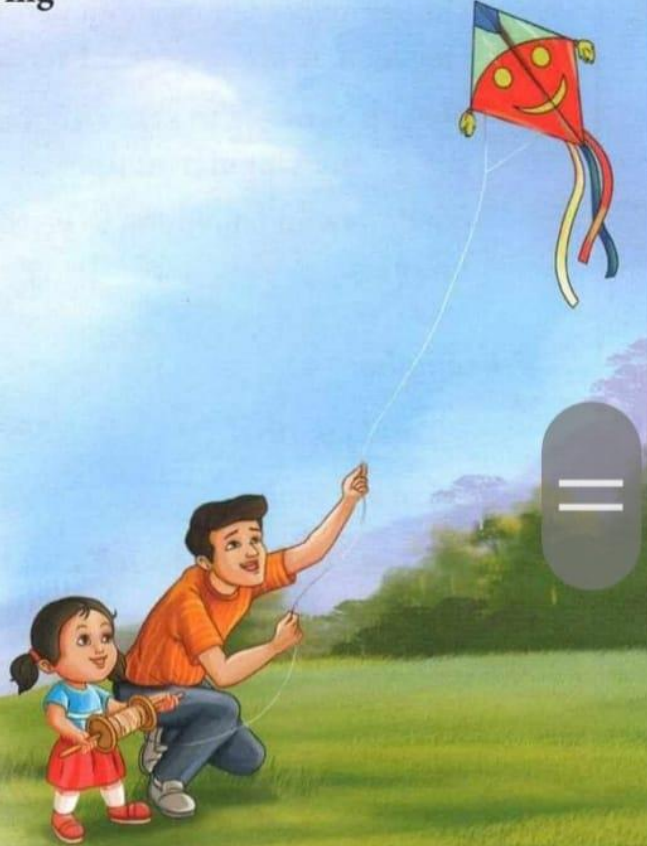
Let us read some long 'i' words:

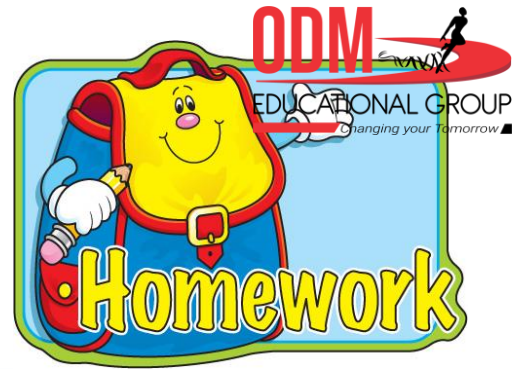
