Words that describe the quality of a naming word (person, place, animal or thing) are called describing words or adjectives.

beautiful car



Words for numbers, colours, size and shape are also **describing words**.





An adjective also describes how someone or something looks, tastes, feels, smells or sounds like.



beautiful girl

'beautiful' describes the looks of the girl






salty chips 'salty' describes the taste of the chips



soft pillow 'soft' describes the feel of the pillow







loud music 'loud' describes the sound of the music
