The words **is**, **are** and **am** are action words that do not show any action.

They tell us about the time of an action.

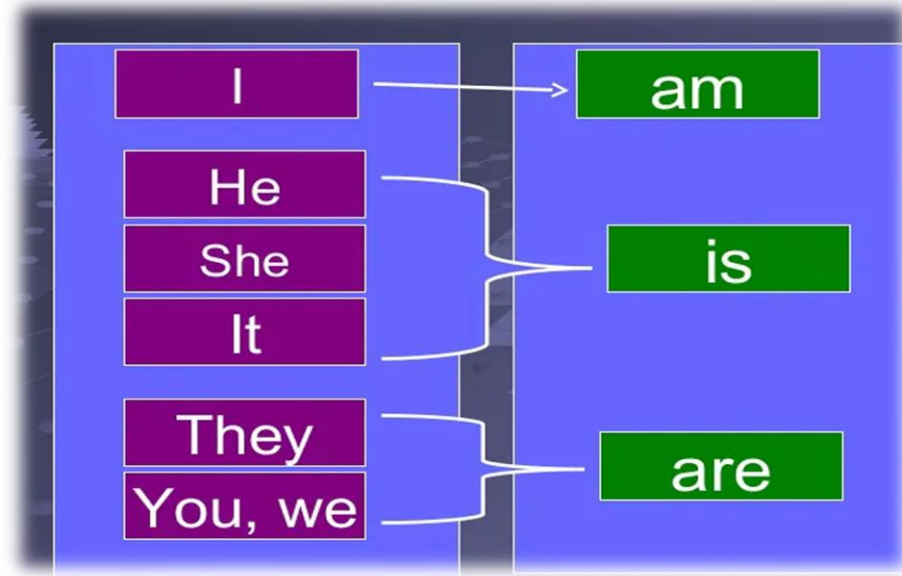
They also help in giving more information about the noun.

We use **'is'** with singular naming parts.

We use **'are'** with plural naming parts.

We use **'am'** with I.

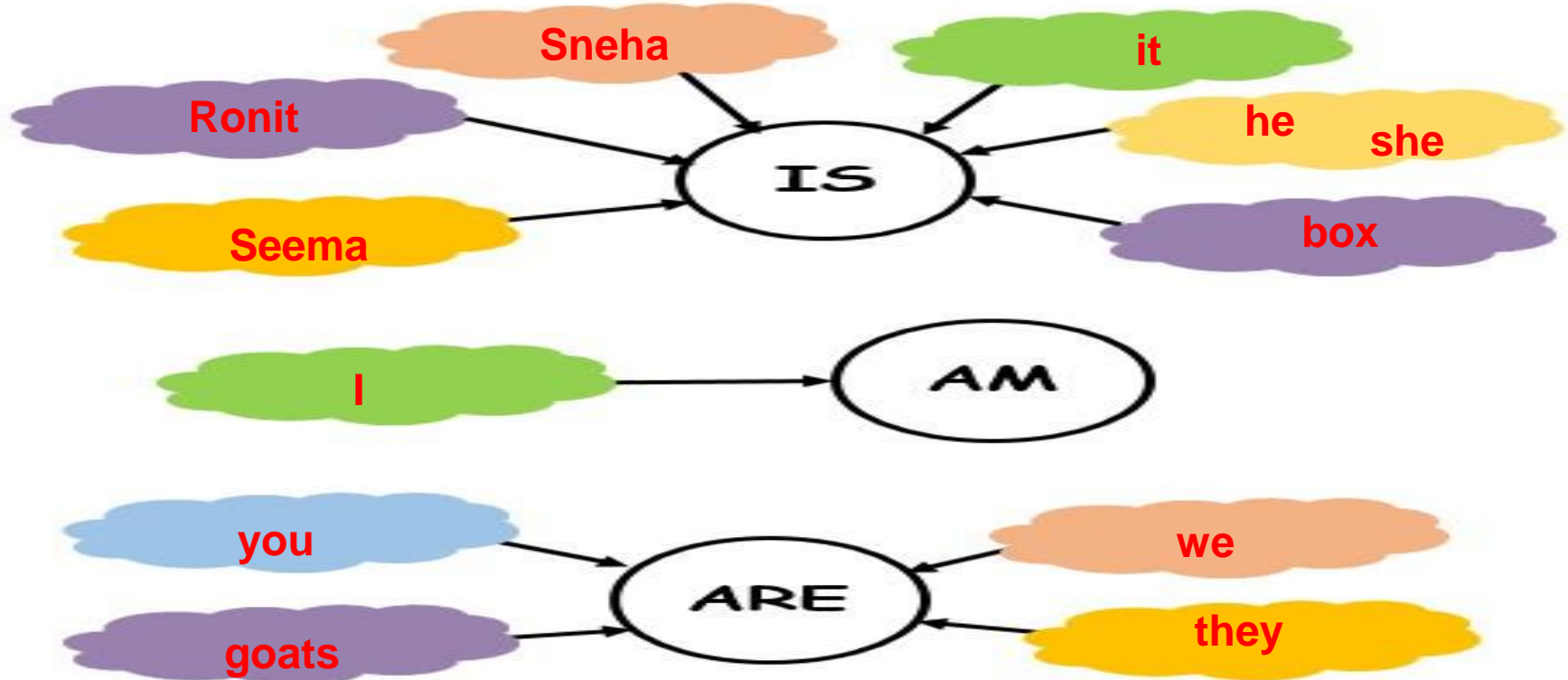
We always use **'are'** with you.
