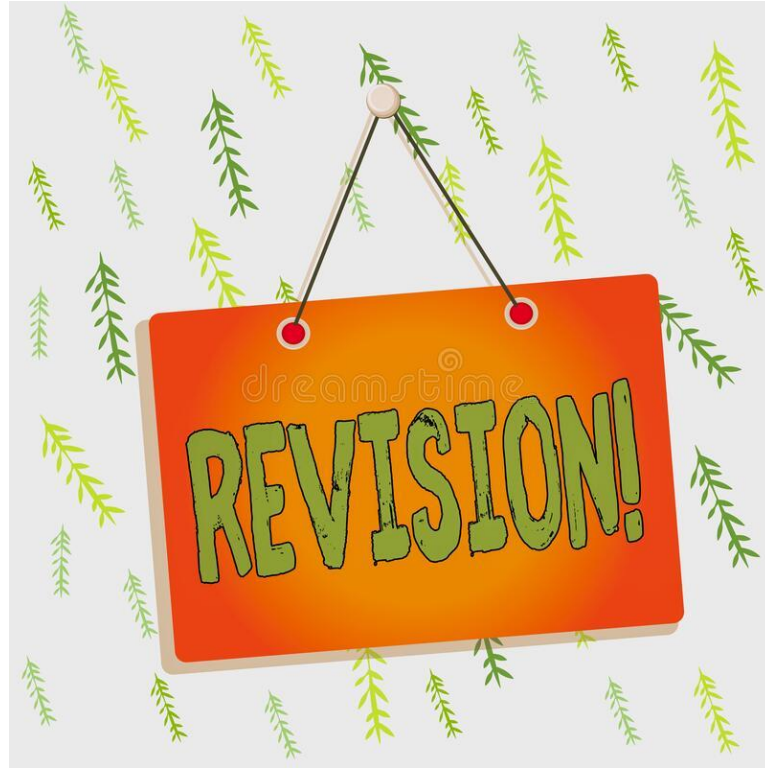

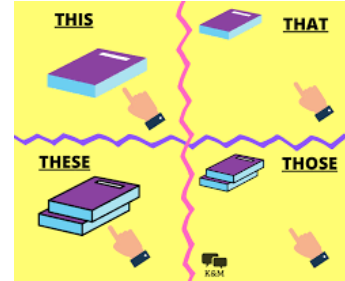

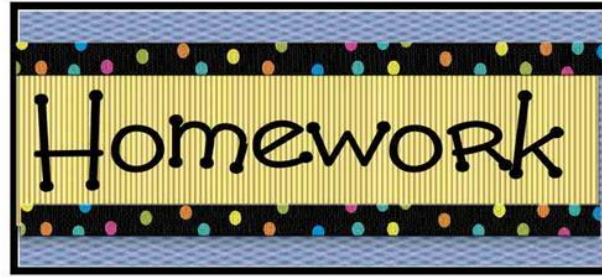

The Spelling of Regular Past Tense Verbs

<p>Verb + <u>ed</u></p> <p><i>E.g. want+<u>ed</u> → wanted</i> <i>work+<u>ed</u> → worked</i> <i>call+<u>ed</u> → called</i></p>	<p>Verb, ending in <u>-e + d</u></p> <p><i>E.g. dance+<u>d</u> → danced</i> <i>live+<u>d</u> → lived</i> <i>die+<u>d</u> → died</i></p>
<p>Verb, ending in <u>-y</u>: change y to <u>i + ed</u></p> <p><i>E.g. cry → <u>cried</u></i> <i>try → <u>tried</u></i></p>	<p>One vowel verb: <u>double the consonant + ed</u></p> <p><i>E.g. stop → <u>stopped</u></i> <i>beg → <u>begged</u></i></p>
