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





The Spelling of Regular Past Tense Verbs

Verb + <u>ed</u>	Verb, ending in –e + d			
E.g. want+ ed → want <u>ed</u>	E.g. dance+ d → danc <u>ed</u>			
work+ ed → work <u>ed</u>	live+ d → liv <u>ed</u>			
call+ ed → call <u>ed</u>	die+ d → di <u>ed</u>			
Verb, ending in –y: change y to i + ed	One vowel verb: double the consonant + ed			
E.g. cry→ cr <u>ied</u>	E.g. stop → stopped			
try→ tried	beg → begged
