LET'S RECAPITULATE

- Animals need food to grow, to stay healthy and to get energy.
- All animals directly or indirectly depend on plants for food.
- A food chain tells us which animal eats what in nature.
- Some animals eat plants are called herbivores. Some eat flesh of other animals are called carnivores and some eat both plants and the flesh of other animals are called omnivores.
- Domestic animals do a lot of work for us. They need energy-giving food.



ANIMALS THAT SWALLOW THEIR FOOD WHOLE

- Snakes swallow their food whole. They do not bite or chew their food.
- A frog catches the insects with its long and sticky tongue. It shoots out its tongue to catch insects.
- They do not have biting or chewing teeth.

ANIMALS THAT TEAR AND CHEW FLESH

- The flesh eating animals like lions, tigers, foxes and dog chew flesh and bones.
- They have very sharp, pointed and curved front teeth to tear flesh.
- They also have strong grinding teeth at the back of their mouths.

ANIMALS THAT GNAW

- **Gnaw** means to bite something repeatedly or chew it hard.
- Animals like rabbits, rats and squirrels gnaw their food.
- They have very sharp front teeth.
- These teeth help them to bite into seeds and fruits.
