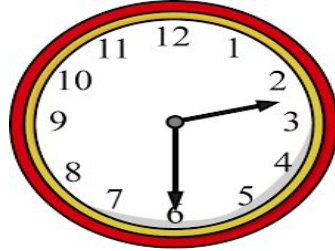
Listening and Speaking junction (pg – 27)

2:00 – It's two o' clock

2:05 – It's five past two

2:10 – It's ten past two

2:15 – It's quarter past two

2:20 – It's twenty past two

2:25 – It's twenty-five past two

2:30 – It's half past two

2:35 – It's twenty- five to three

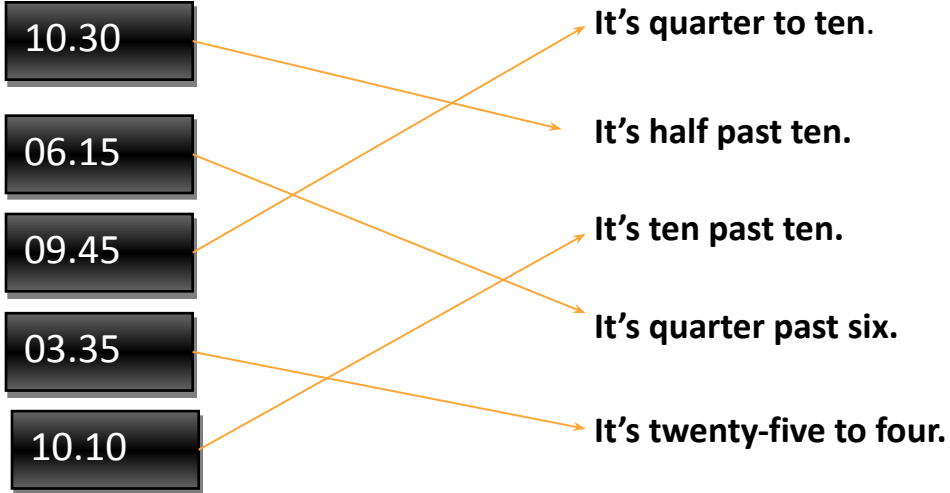
2:40 – It's twenty to three

2:45 – It's quarter to three

2:50 – It's ten to three

2:55 – It's five to three
