VOCABULARY JUNCTION

Read these sentences

He tried to **untie** himself but he was **unable** to move.

He stared at them in **disbelief**

The word untie and unable is formed by adding **un-** to the word **tie** & **able**.

The word disbelief is formed by adding **dis-** to the word **belief**.

PREFIX is a letter or a group of letters added before a word to change its meaning.

Examples

un + cover = uncover

dis + agree = disagree

in + correct = incorrect

dis + like = dislike

Read the sentence

A long time ago, there lived a man named Lemuel Gulliver. He was a **sailor**.

Gulliver was a **sailor**. The suffix **-or** added to the word **sail** changes it to **sailor**, which means 'one who goes sailing.'

We use the suffixes **-er**, **-or** and **-ian** to form words that mean **one who does an action**.

Examples

Photograph + **-er** = photographer

Edit + **-or** = editor

Wait + **-er** = waiter



library + **-ian** = librarian

history + **-ian** = historian

comedy + **-ian** = comedian



If the word ends with **y**, we drop it and add **-ian**

- The letter **l** is silent in walk
- The letter **u** is silent in built
- The letter **t** is silent in listen

half	guess	whistle
