Out of the doors at all today.

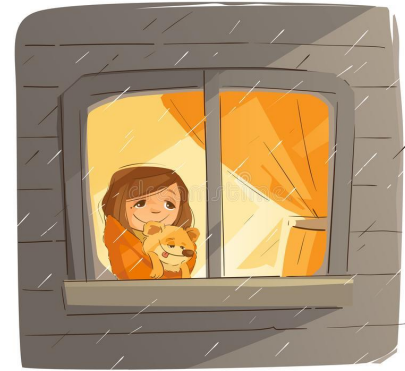
Tell me, little raindrops,

## New Words and its meanings

2. window pane – a flat piece of glass used in a window
3. out of doors – outside
4. rain drops – drops of rain
