VERBS PAST TENSE (IRREGULAR VERBS)

PAST TENSE VERBS:

Past tense verbs **refer to actions or events in** the past. The actions that already happened.



REGULAR PAST TENSE VERBS

Regular Verbs When forming the past tense of regular verbs, add -d or -ed to the present tense form of the verb. • 0

Example: cook, cooked

Simple Past Tense Regular verbs

Spelling rules	Examples
base form + ed	walk → walked play → played
verbs ending in -e + d	like → liked move → moved
verbs ending in a consonant + y \checkmark change y $\rightarrow i$ + ed	carry → carried study → studied



IRREGULAR PAST TENSE VERBS





Some irregular verbs do not change at all when they are used in the past tense.

PRESENT	PAST
SHUT	SHUT
HURT	HURT
BURST	BURST
READ	READ
COST	COST
HIT	HIT
PUT	PUT
LET	LET
CUT	CUT
BEAT	BEAT



READ THE SENTENCES

- * I fell down and my finger was <u>hurt</u>.
- * I read this story last night .

toys away.


