

Nouns: Singular and Plural


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Singular & Plural Nouns

A Singular Noun names <u>one</u> person, place, thing or idea. Examples: fly, house, box, dream

A Plural Noun names 2 or more people, places, things, or ideas. Plural nouns have many spelling rules.





Nouns end with consonant + y, change y to i and add es

Nouns end with vowel + y, add s




