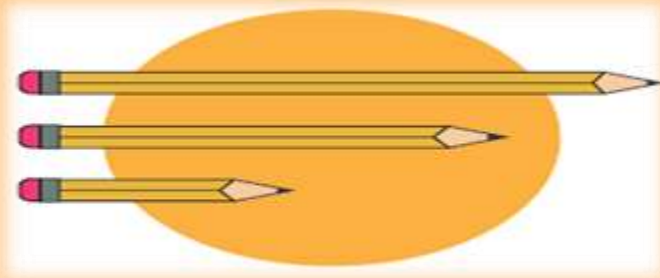

The Adjective

Degrees of Comparison

There are three degree of adjective:

1. Positive - e.g. fast, great, old.
2. Comparative - e.g. Faster, greater, older.
3. Superlative - e.g. Fastest, Greatest, Oldest.



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Positive Degree of Adjective:

When an adjective is in its base form, it is called **positive adjective**.

Example:



The grasshopper is **lazy**.



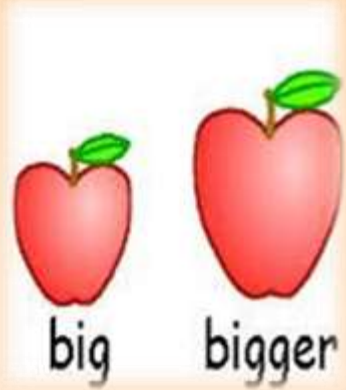
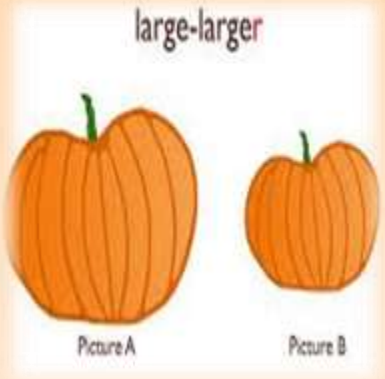
The **bright** Sun is smiling at **white** cloud.

Comparative degree of Adjectives:

When we add **-er** at the end of an adjective to compare two nouns ,we call it a **comparative adjective**. This form of adjective is known as **comparative degree** .



Examples:

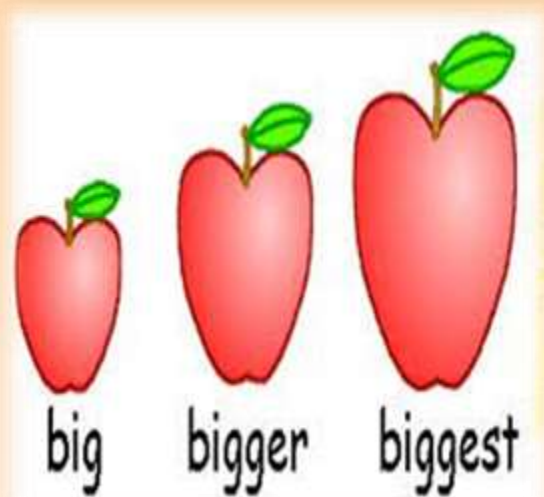


Superlative degree of Adjectives:

When we add **-est** at the end of an adjective to compare more than two nouns, we call it a **superlative adjective**. This form of adjective is known as **superlative degree**.
