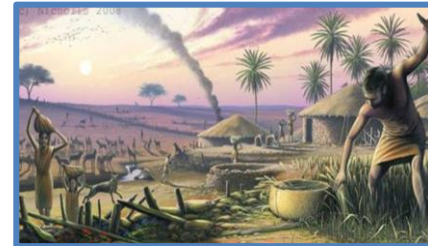
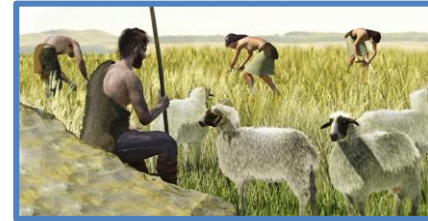

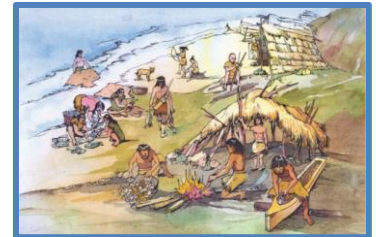
THE BEGINNING OF FARMING

- Early humans kept moving from place to place In search of food.
- They soon found that whenever they threw the seeds of fruit new plants grew from them. When these plants became big fruits that grew on them.
- Early humans discovered farming.
- They learned now knew that they could plant seeds and grow their food, rather than go searching for it from place to place and can settled down in one place.



SETTLING IN VILLAGES
