BUILDING

ENVIRONMENT

Anything that surrounds us is called our environment.

Our environment includes everything around us – both living and non-living things.

We find people, plants, and animals are called living things.

LIVING THINGS



ENVIRONMENT

Also, some other things like roads, buildings, cars, chairs, and tables are called non-living things.

Both living and non-living things together make up our environment.

NON-LIVING THINGS



SOME DIFFERENCES BETWEEN LIVING AND NON-LIVING THINGS

1	Living things grow	Non-Living things do no grow.
2	Living things can move	Non-living things cannot move on their own.
3	Living things need food	Non-living things do not need food.
4	Living things breathe	Non-living things cannot breathe.
5	Living things reproduce	Non-living things cannot reproduce.

NATURAL AND HUMAN-MADE ENVIRONMENT

The natural environment includes all those made by nature, like soil, water, air, plants and animals.

Some other things like buildings, roads, cars, computers and clothes are part of the human-made environment.
