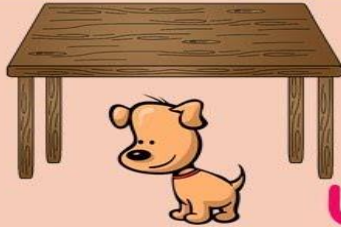
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Prepositions are words that show the relationship of a main noun or pronoun with other words in a sentence. They answer the question where or when.

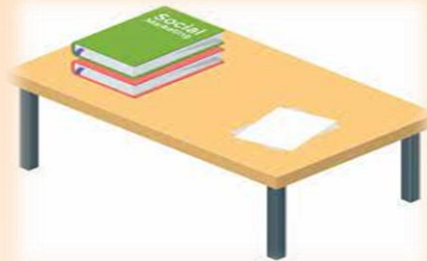

Let us learn about some more prepositions

Between:

Between is used when someone or something is in the middle of two other things or people. **Example –**



There is an outhouse between the two trees.



Hellen is sitting between Jack and Tom.

Behind:

- **Behind** is used when someone or something is at the back of a person or thing.

Example –



The boy is standing **behind** the chair.



The children are hiding **behind** the bush.

Near:

Near is used when two or more things, places or people are close to each other.

Example –



The man is standing **near** the Biju Pattnaik Airport.



The children are playing **near** the treehouse.

With :

With is used when two or more things or people are together in the same place.

Example –



I want tea **with** biscuits.



I ordered a sandwich **with** cheese.

From:

From is used to state the point at which something or someone starts or originates. It can also be used to state the distance between one place and another.

Example –



My house is 4 km away **from** the school.



I am **from** Odisha.

To:

To is used to state the final point in a journey.

Example –



My mother is going **to** office.



I am going **to** Nepal tomorrow.
