Adverbs of Time

Adverbs of time change or qualify the meaning of a sentence by telling us **when** an action happens.

These adverbs always answer one important question: **When???**



- The train has **already** left.
- We moved into our new house **last week**.
Our favorite T.V. program starts **at 6'o clock**.
- I'm going to my new school **tomorrow**.
- She stayed at her grandmother's house **all day**.
- **Later** Robin Hood stole the king's crown.





adverbs of time

These tell us when an action happened.



adverb	example
afterwards	We'll go for a pizza afterwards.
again	I watched the film again and again.
already	The bus has already left.
before	I need to go shopping before I go home.
early	She got up early.
immediately	We need to tell someone immediately.
lately	I haven't been myself lately.
last week/month	We played well last week.
now	I need it now.
