Possessive Adjectives and Possessive Pronouns

POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

A possessive pronoun is a pronoun that is used to indicate possession or ownership.

- This pen is **my pen**, not **your pen**.
- This pen is **mine**, not **yours**.



MINE

- This is my laptop. It's **mine**.

Possessive Adjectives

- Possessive adjectives are used to express the idea of belonging and possession.
- **My** house means the house belonging to me.
Your homework means the homework you are doing.
- We use possessive adjectives before nouns:
my book **his** exam **their** car

What's the difference?



Possessive adjectives (possessive determiners)

possessive adjective + noun

- my** This is my book.
- your** Is this your umbrella?
- his** He lent me his jacket.
- her** I borrowed her car.
- its** Do you like my doll?
These are its clothes.
- our** A lot of our friends
came to our party.
- their** Their house is lovely.

Possessive pronouns

possessive pronoun (+ no noun)

- mine** This book is mine.
- yours** Is this yours?
- his** This isn't my jacket. It's his.
- hers** The car is hers.
- *We avoid using "its" alone
as a possessive pronoun.*
- ours** That car is ours.
- theirs** That house is theirs.
