Filthy is a strong adjective which means the highest degree, the most dirty it can be. Strong adjectives are adjectives which are used instead of using very with a normal adjective. Strong adjectives are more expressive than normal adjectives and are used with adverbs like really or absolutely.

EXAMPLES OF WEAK AND STRONG ADJECTIVES

- Happy- thrilled
- Hot – boiling
- Hungry – starving
- Ugly – awful
- Bad - terrible
