Positive	Comparative	Superlative
Dark	Darker	Darkest
Brave	Braver	Bravest
Sweet	Sweeter	Sweetest
Slow	Slower	Slowest
Tall	Taller	Tallest
Long	Longer	Longest
Pretty	Prettier	Prettiest

Rules of using Degrees of Comparisonal GROUP



RULES	EXAMPLES	
We can use positive form to compararison by using "as adjective as"	Mini is as wise as Maman	
An adjective in comparative degree are usually followed by "than"	Tina <u>more dilligent</u> than her brother.	
Use "the" before superlative degree of adjective.	She is <u>the best</u> student in this class.	
An adjective in superlative degree is usually followed by "of" or "in"	She is <u>the biggest girl</u> in this school. Study is the most important thing of my life.	
We can't use double comparatives or superlatives.	Incorect: It is more darker here.
