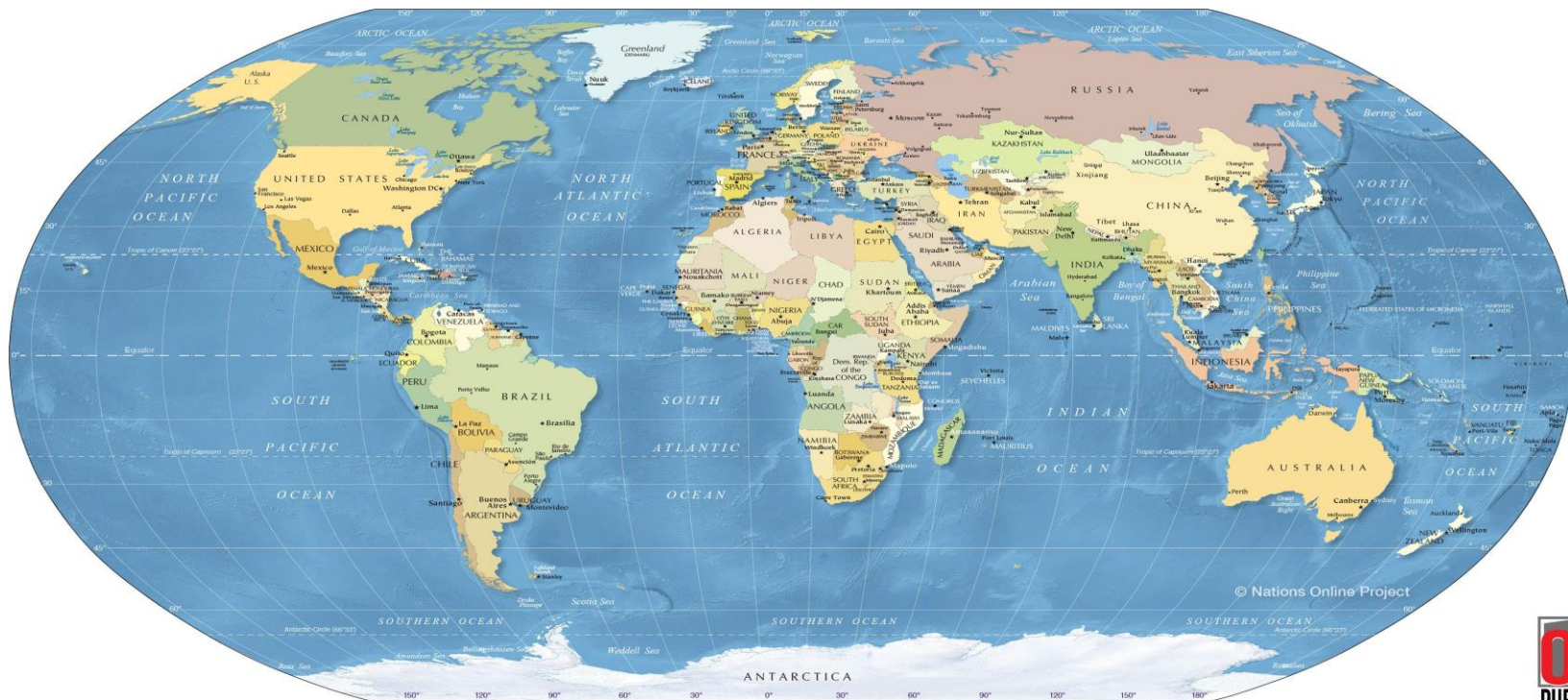
Unity in Diversity

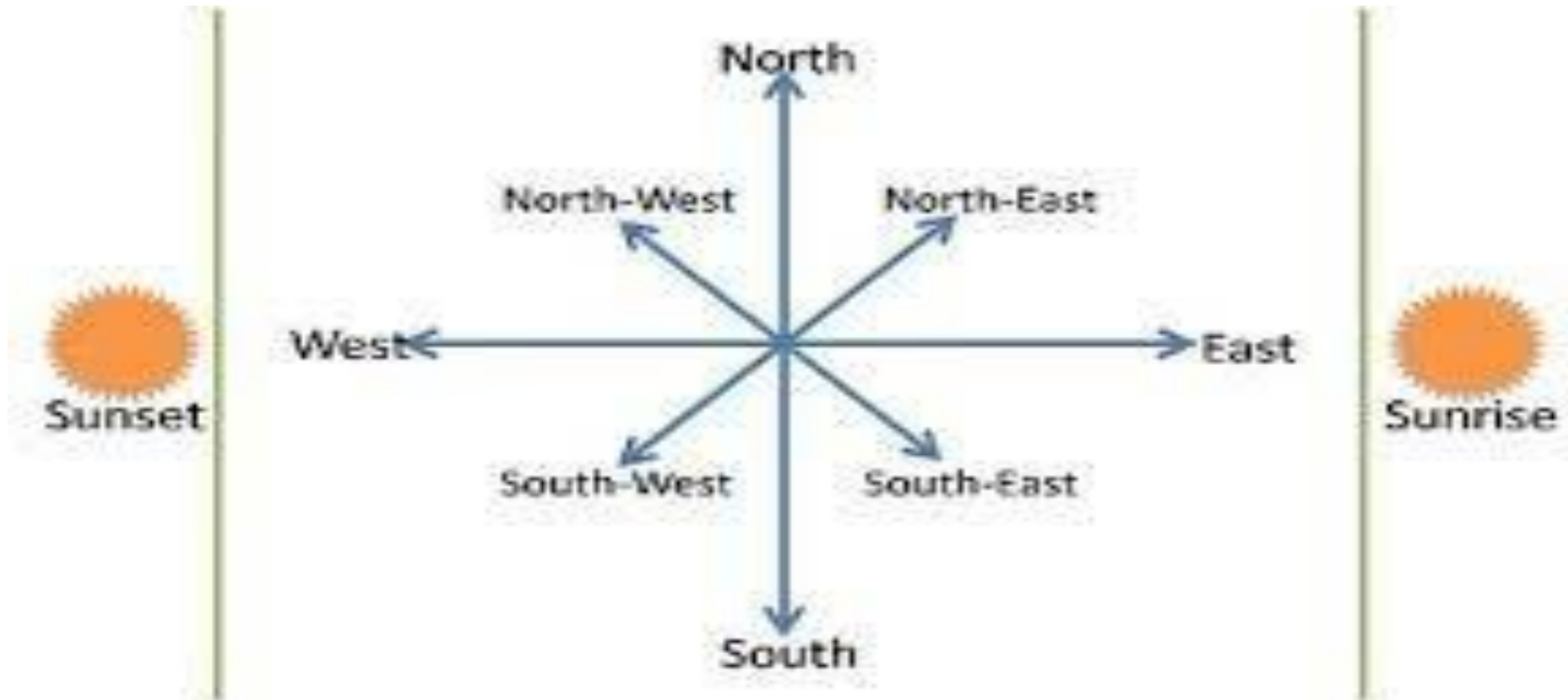


**India is a vast land,
