

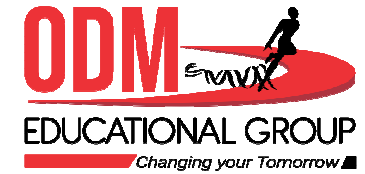

Conditional Clauses in English



Conditionals

If clause

Main clause

| | | |
|---|---|--|
| 0 Conditional Used for present real/factual situations | Present simple If it rains, | Present simple the ground gets wet. |
| 1st Conditional Used for future Real/factual situations | 1st Conditional If I have enough Money, | 1st Conditional I will buy a car. |
| 2nd Conditional Used for present or future unreal situations | 2nd Conditional If I had Money, | 2nd Conditional I would give you. (but I don't have money) |
| 3st Conditional Used for past unreal situations | 3st Conditional If he had talked to me, | 3st Conditional I would have listened to him. (but he didn't talk to me) |

If + Condition + Result

IF

+

Simple
Present

USE

- General Truths
- Habits
- Real World
- Scientific Facts, etc.

EXAMPLES:

- If it rains, the ground gets wet.
- If I cry, I have a headache.
- If you mix yellow and blue, you get green.
- If you are tired, you go to bed early.
- If you leave the object, it drops
- If you pour oil on water, it floats.
- If you smoke, you get old early.
- If you leave the object, it drops.

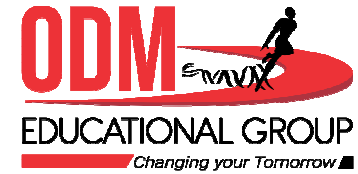

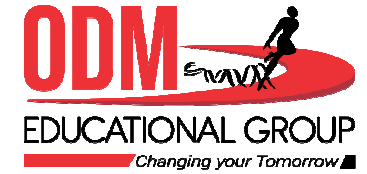
