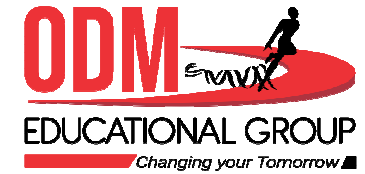

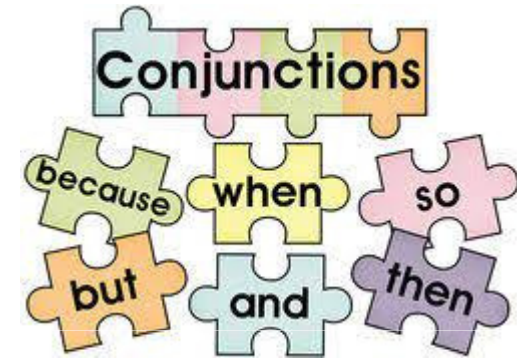

### CONJUNCTIONS

Words that are used for joining other words, phrases or sentences are called conjunctions.

while

before

yet

Life is full of troubles **yet** none wants to die.

Robin did not try hard **so** he did not succeed.

Play up to your potential **otherwise**, you will be left out of the team.

A conjunction which makes a connection between two parallel words, two parallel phrases, or independent clauses is called a coordinating conjunction. The coordinating conjunctions are ***and, but, or, as well as, for, so, yet***, etc.

The conjunctions that connect groups of words or phrases which are generally similar in nature are called as **Coordinating Conjunctions**.

<b>But</b>	<b>However</b>	All the children wanted to eat pizza, <b>but</b> no one wanted to buy it

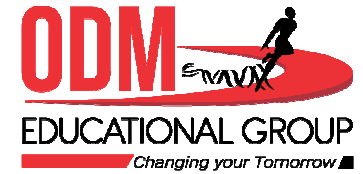


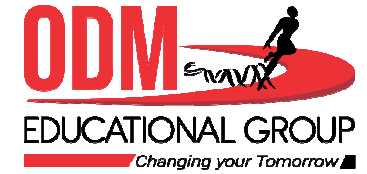
