#### **CHANGING YOUR TOMORROW**


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### **LEARNING OBJECTIVE:**

- I <u>will buy</u> a toy train tomorrow.
- They will go to Delhi next Sunday.

The above sentences speak about an action that will happen in the future. They are in future tense. We will learn about Simple Future tense and Future Continuous tense.

#### Simple Future Tense

- It is used to denote facts or events of certainty.
- It is used to give a warning or take a spontaneous decision.
- To express readiness.
- Make an offer or suggestion.
- To give an invitation or an order to someone.



#### Some examples:

- I will prepare dinner.
- Why will not / won't you tell her the truth?
- It will rain tomorrow.

Structure of Simple Future Tense

#### Subject + will / shall + main verb
