What is this?

Whom did you meet on the way?

The pronoun which is used to ask questions about any person or things are called Interrogative Pronouns.

OR

Interrogative pronouns are question words that act as pronouns in questions.



Interrogative Pronouns

Interrogative pronouns are used to ask questions.

who

for people
(used as the subject of a
verb)

subject verb

- Who loves pies?
- Who won yesterday?

whom

for people
(used as the object of a
verb or preposition)

verb object

- You saw whom?
- You went with whom?

preposition object

whose

for people and things
(shows possession)

- Whose is this?
- Whose won the race?

what

for animals and
things

- What is that?
- What do you mean?



which

for animals and
things

- Which is smarter?
- Which is faster?
- Which is heavier?



Interrogative pronouns

Interrogative pronouns assist in forming questions. There are five interrogative pronouns. Each one is used to ask a specific question or indirect question:

what which who whom whose



WHAT is your name?



WHOM does Jim live with?



WHICH is your favourite sport?



WHOSE book is that?



WHO is your favourite singer?
