Elderly man dies in traffic accident

A 75-year-old North Fort Myers criver died Monday after he was hit by an escenning car on North Tarsianti Trail, Florida Highway Patrol. Trooper Mars Boatright said

According to Boatright:

John Robert Brown of 25 Pletcher Drive was driving a 1877 Plymouth southbound on North Tamismi Trail, 2.8 miles north of Fort Myers, when he was bit by a car driven by Mark Shannon Levell, 18, of 1656 Naile Road, North Fort Myers, about 6.14g.m. Monday.

Lovell, driving a 1982 Datest, was northbound and passing other northbound vehicles. He ran into Brown's car, span 180 degrees and his Brown's car again.

Lovell suffered a broken leg and facial injuries. He and Brown were rushed to Lee Memorial Hospital, where Brown died three bours later. Lovell was itsied in fair condition late Thursday.

He was charged with driving too fast for road conditions, improper passing and driving with a suspended license.

Accident claims lives of five doctors in Nashik, one injured

The six were returning to Pimpalgaon Baswant after attending a meet

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE PUNE, MAY 18

FIVE DOCTORS from Pimpalgaon Baswant town in Nashik district lost their lives while another was seriously injured after the car they were travelling in hit an unidentified heavy vehicle from behind on the Mumbai-Agra highway in the early hours of Monday.

Nashik Rural police said the incident took place around 2.30 am when the doctors were returning to Pimpalgaon Baswant in a multi-utility vehicle (MUV) after attending a medical practitioners' meet in Nashik city.

The police have identified the deceased doctors as Dr Pratap Shelke (48), Dr Suresh Patil (40), both gynecologists. Dr Sanjay

pediatricians. The injured person has been identified as Dr

Amol Bhosle. The accident took

place near Kökangaon village in Ozar taluka.

Inspector Prakash Medhe, in charge of Ozar police station and the investigating officer in the case, said, "As per our primary

investigation, the car in which these doctors were travelling rammed into a heavy vehicle from behind. There is a speed-breaker at the accident spot. Based on the location of the speed-breaker and the tyre marks, it seems the heavy vehicle suddenly applied brakes and driver of this car could not control the speed. The car was very badly damaged."

Inspector Medhe added,
"The police control room received a call from the staffers of
a nearby petrol pump who had
heard a loud sound of the collision. The five doctors had sustained very severe injuries, they
died on the spot."

The police said the bodies were handed over to the family members after post-mortem. All five doctors were well known in Pimpalgaon Baswant town.

SAFETY AT HOME



SLIPPING ON THE FLOOR

- Keep the floor dry and clean.
- Do not leave your toys and other things lying on the floor.
- Use a step ladder or a stool to reach something placed high.







SAFETY AT HOME



BURNS

- Accidents due to a fire in the kitchen can cause serious injury (or even death)
- To avoid such accidents one must not wear synthetic clothes in the kitchen.
 Such clothes catch fire easily.
- Gas stoves when not in use must be turned off.





SAFETY AT HOME



ELECTRIC SHOCKS

- Do not touch electric fittings with wet hands.
- Do not go too close to table fans or heaters if they are on.
- If someone gets an electric shock or sees a spark, the main switch must be turned off immediately.









POISONING

- Accidental consumption of chemicals and medicines can cause poisoning.
- Poisonous chemicals should be properly labeled and kept away from eatables.
- Do not take medicine without asking an adult.









- Do not rush up or down the stairs. You may fall and hurt yourself and others.
- Do not climb on desks and chairs or throw things around.
