PHONIC JUNCTION

Read the words aloud pride, spied, vice, price.

They have same vowel sound.

Let us read aloud some more words that have the same sound.

Child, light, hide, write, cry, time etc



Grammar junction

Words that are normally verbs can be used as adjectives. If a word modifies a noun or pronoun or verb, it is an adjective. Sometimes the present participle (verb plus ing) forms of a verb becomes an adjective Example- A rolling stone gathers no moss.

The flattered crow, who did not see the joke.

The word flattered is formed from the verb flatter. It is the past participle form of the verb flatter. Here it is modifying the crow so it is used as an adjective.

Some verbs that end in -ed, -d, -t,-en are used as adjectives.

My mother prefers filtered coffee than tea.

It is frozen chocolate milk
