The words with red letters have a verb and a preposition. Words that are made up of a verb and a preposition are called **phrasal verbs**.

- fill up- fill to capacity- She filled up the basket with vegetables.
- Put on- wear- put on your shoes.
- Give up- stop doing something – She give up taking care of the plants.
