No, I do not think it is right to flatter others to get things done as it is not the righteous way to do things.

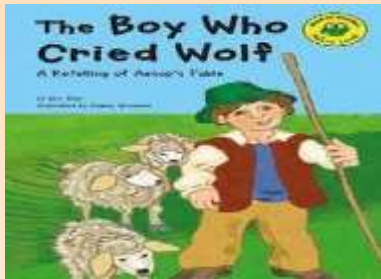
