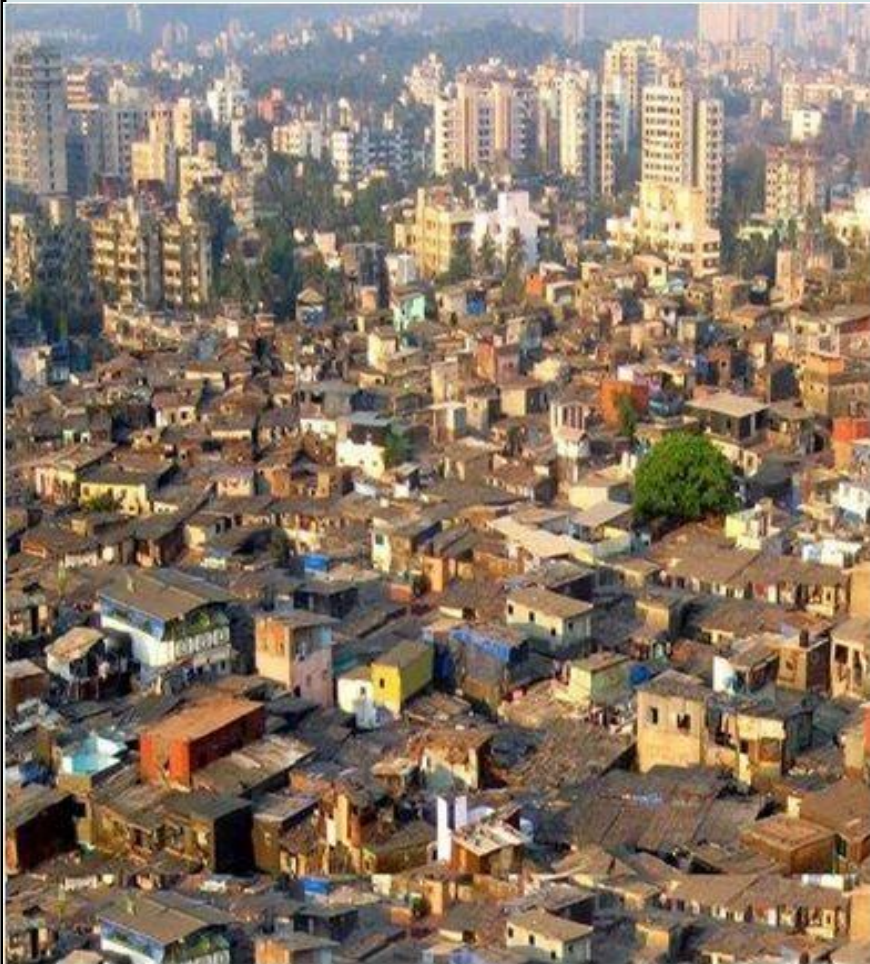
What do they show?

- 1.They show that poverty means hunger and lack of shelter.*
- 2.Poverty also means lack of clean water and sanitation facilities.*
- 3.It also means lack of a regular job at a minimum decent level.*





Now poverty is looked at through other social indicators like illiteracy level, lack of access to health care, lack of job opportunities, lack of access to safe drinking water, sanitation, etc.



SOCIAL EXCLUSION-As per this concept, poverty must be seen in terms of the poor having to live only in a poor surrounding with other poor people, excluded from enjoying social equality of better-off people in better surroundings

VULNERABILITY- Vulnerability describes the greater probability of certain communities or individuals of becoming, or remaining, poor in the coming years.

- The people from backward castes, individuals like widows, and the physically handicapped are more vulnerable.
- They possess greater risks at the time of natural disasters.
